

Authorities investigate shooting death in Huron residence

A 23-year-old Huron man has been arrested on a charge of second-degree murder in a weekend shooting death at a southwest Huron residence.

Christopher Aguayo is accused of killing Richard Bosque-gonzalez, also 23, in the victim's house at 360 Sixth St. S.W. during the early morning hours on Sunday.

Bosque-gonzalez died from a single gunshot wound to the head. He had moved to Huron last August. Since the incident, Aguayo has been held at the Regional Correction Center on a parole violation.

He was arrested on the murder charge Monday evening.

A second-degree murder conviction carries a mandatory sentence of life in prison.

Law enforcement authorities said there had been an earlier argument at Mulligan's, but not between the defendant and the victim. Anyone with information on others involved in the argument is asked to notify authorities.

Investigating the case are the Huron Police Department and the state Division of Criminal Investigation.
